In our beautiful, historic church building, we offer an outstanding music program, including vibrant adult and youth choirs that bring joy to St. Mary's worship services and activities.

St. Mary's has an average Sunday attendance of 130, with 30 children enrolled in our church school. We have 117 pledging units, which provides us with a sound financial foundation.

Our Facilities

The oldest church building in Newton, St. Mary's Episcopal Church opened its doors in 1813. The church, which is listed on the National Registry of Historic Places, features interior square columns and high box pews

with needlepoint kneelers. It has seating for 350 people.



The 2.5-acre grounds overlooking the Charles River include the rectory and the historic churchyard, where Revolutionary and Civil War veterans are buried. The church and grounds have been lovingly maintained.

Various neighborhood groups share our space, including, for more than 50 years, the Hills and Falls Nursery School.

Newton Lower Falls Community

St. Mary's is located in Newton Lower Falls, near Weston, Wellesley, and Needham, and it attracts parishioners from at least ten different communities. Only seven miles from downtown Boston and easily accessible via public transportation, Newton is statistically recognized as one of the safest cities in the US.

With a diverse, multicultural community of 80,000 people, Newton comprises thirteen villages, each with its own character. The community offers excellent schools and close proximity to outstanding medical facilities, colleges, museums, restaurants, and numerous recreational facilities. The nearby Charles River offers opportunities for such activities as hiking and kayaking.
