#### Migration as a Result of Economic Interventions


Positive correlation between U.S. investment patterns and migration flows






# Executive Branch

Let's look at where the Immigration Office was located within the **Executive Branch** Bureaucracy over time

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







### In 1924

the U.S. Government understood and labeled immigrants as workers



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


# 1940 Department of Justice



### Bureaucratic Position of the Immigration Office

### ICE - Immigration & Customs Enforcement Dept. of Homeland Security (Bush)

- Separated services (CIS formally INS) from enforcement (ICE)
- Increased the detention system
- Created a larger enforcement system than all other law enforcement put together

# Legislative Branch

### 1986

### Immigration Reform & Control Act (Reagan)

- Employer Sanctions
- Amnesty Legalization for Undocumented Immigrants

### 1996

### Illegal Immigration & Immigrant Responsibility Act (Clinton)

- Created a retro-active double standard in the criminal code for immigrants
- Allowed for the imprisonment of undocumented immigrants
- Criminalized being an immigrant

- Being Undocumented:
- Not a criminal OR civil violation
- It is an <u>ADMINISTRATIVE</u>
  VIOLATION

### Judicial Branch

### Plenary Power Doctrine

- 1889 U.S. Supreme Court <u>UPHELD</u> the Chinese Exclusion Act even though it discriminated on the bases of national origin
- Supreme Court applied the Plenary Power Doctrine to justify the discrimination which is unconstitutional
- Gives the legislative and executive branches sole power over who is admitted and who is excluded from entering the U.S.
- Exempts the laws that regulate immigration from judicial review. In other words, laws that regulate immigration can violate constitutional rights. They can discriminate on the basis of race, ethnicity, religion, or gender and courts can refuse to provide judicial scrutiny.
- A legal doctrine that is being slowly applied to immigrants legally admitted into the U.S.



### Deaths at the Border



#### Since the NAFTA - 1994

- 7,000 people have died crossing the border
- Approximately 500,000 people have entered the U.S. illegally per year
- However, between 1990–1994, a total of a half a million entered illegally

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#### Contrary to popular opinion,

- Over 80% of families have mixed status, one person may be a green card holder or U.S. citizen and another may be undocumented
- Undocumented people pay taxes. The 1912 Revenue Act states that every person living in the U.S., whether they are documented or not, are required to pay income tax

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### TAXING THE UNDOCUMENTED

One example
Social Security Taxes Collected

- \$13 Billion collected every year from undocumented immigrants
- \$100 Billion paid to the SSA by undocumented immigrants over the past decade

### Impact of Criminalizing Policies

### TEAR FAMILIES APART & DISREGARD HUMAN LIFE

- 3,162,844 deportation (under Obama)
- 5.3 million children live in the U.S. with one or more undocumented parents
- From 2014-16, % of all deportations:
  - 19.8% violent or potentially violent criminal conviction
  - 21.2% nonviolent criminal conviction
  - o 18.7% immigration administrative violation
  - o 10.4% no violation (DHS data 2017)
