In September 2012, violence struck at the heart of the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts when 19-year-old Jorge Fuentes was murdered while walking his dog outside his home in Dorchester. He was an exuberant, remarkable young man and natural leader, adored by the children he mentored at St. Stephen's Church and St. Mary's Church in Boston and respected by his peers. Many in our diocese knew him because he grew up and worked in the B-SAFE summer and B-READY afterschool programs and the Barbara C. Harris Camp of our church.



After Jorge's murder, then Bishop M. Thomas Shaw, SSJE convened a group of clergy and lay leaders to help determine how our diocesan community could take meaningful action toward alleviating some of the root causes of violence across eastern Massachusetts. The 2012 Diocesan Convention formalized that group and its charge by unanimously voting to create the Jorge Fuentes Antiviolence Task Force. Our 2013 Diocesan Convention reaffirmed this commitment and the work continues!

Educational Opportunities & Liturgy

- Organize 50+ congregations to read The Rich and the Rest of Us
- Host 350+ Episcopalians at Diocesan **Resource Day**
- Mobilize 900 Episcopalians to march in the Louis D. Brown Peace Institute's Mother's Day Walk for Peace (2 years)
- Starting a book group discussion on The New Jim Crow
- Developing liturgical resources on the root causes of violence
- Organizing an educational event with a speaker for Spring 2015

Family & Youth Engagement

- Conduct a youth & family needs assessment survey (45 responses)
