Listening team hands off revised report to mission strategy drafting team Following a two-week public response period in April, the diocesan mission strategy listening team has revised its initial report based on input it received at four open sessions, attended by 54 people, and through 26 survey responses.

The revised report is available here.

The mission strategy drafting team, recently appointed by Diocesan Council and Bishop Alan M. Gates, will use the findings in the revised report and other information about the strengths and challenges for the diocese and wider Episcopal Church to create a draft mission strategy. That draft will be made available during the summer so that the diocesan community can provide feedback. Based on that feedback, the drafting team will make any necessary revisions before the proposed mission strategy goes before the Diocesan Council in early fall and then to the Diocesan Convention for final approval in November.

Bill Parnell named canon to the ordinary

The Ven. William Clay Parnell, currently the archdeacon for mission in the Diocese of New York, has been named canon to the ordinary in the Diocese of Massachusetts. A June 1 start date is anticipated.

As canon to the ordinary, Parnell will have both external and internal responsibilities, ranging from cultivating healthy relationships throughout the diocese to administrative oversight. He will work closely with Bishop Alan. M. Gates, to ensure pastoral and strategic response throughout the diocese.

"Bill Parnell comes to us with an exceptional depth of experience in furthering Christ's mission through diocesan and parish systems. Those who've served with him describe Bill as smart, wise, kind and collegial. We look forward to welcoming him to the Diocese of Massachusetts, and benefiting from his gifts," Gates said.

The position includes oversight of the diocesan budget process and its integration with mission strategy, as well as oversight of legal affairs and case management for Title IV clergy disciplinary matters. Parnell will oversee administration of Diocesan Convention and Diocesan Council, and serve as the bishop's representative at various board and agency meetings.

A recent realignment of staff reporting and team formation divides administrative oversight between the canon to the ordinary and Bishop Gayle E. Harris. Parnell will oversee the diocesan development, communications, finance and human resources staff. He will also work in partnership with Canon Libby Berman and the congregational development staff, and provide support for several strategic ministries.
