August forums set for feedback on mission strategy draft

The draft of the new mission strategy for the Diocese of Massachusetts will be available this month for review and response. The draft will be posted at <u>www.diomass.org/new-</u><u>mission-strategy</u> as soon as it becomes available. After the draft's release, the mission strategy drafting team will host a series of forums, giving members of the diocese an opportunity to imagine together how this mission strategy might shape and give life to shared mission in the years to come. **Forums will be held on:**

YLA is a leadership training and spiritual formation program for young people entering 9th and 10th grades. Through YLA, participants create and lead a self-chosen project to connect their home parish and the wider community.
