MA bishops call for 48-hour election prayer vigil

The bishops of both Massachusetts dioceses are calling for a 48hour election prayer vigil, from noon on All Saints Sunday, Nov. 6 through noon on Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 8.

"As our nation approaches its Election Day on Nov. 8, we have a deep yearning for the Holy Spirit to be present in our national life. Individually we express this yearning in a variety of ways according to personal conscience. Collectively, we are called to express this yearning through prayer," Bishop Alan M. Gates and Bishop Gayle E. Harris of the Diocese of Massachusetts and Bishop Douglas J. Fisher of the Diocese of Western Massachusetts say in their call for an election vigil. All congregations are urged to participate in a way that best suits their local traditions and schedules. For some it may be as simple as concluding the Sunday prayers with an extended Litany for the Nation, or holding a special form of Morning Prayer on Nov. 8. Others may wish to hold extended vigils, with prayer in shifts offering continuous intercession.

Congregations are invited to share their vigil plans with the wider diocesan community by e-mailing details to <u>news@</u> diomass.org for posting at www.diomass.org/election-vigil. Resources are posted there as well.

Individuals are also encouraged to join their prayers with those of others during the vigil period. People can use this Facebook event page to share in prayer and discussion from wherever they may be, as well as for posting vigil plans and prayer resources.

Episcopalians of all ages are invited to join Bishop Alan M. Gates of the Diocese of Massachusetts and Bishop Douglas J. Fisher of the Diocese of Western Massachusetts on Saturday, Oct. 22, 12-6 p.m., as they walk a stretch of both dioceses together, from Northborough to Southborough, and then join for a pre-election discussion program with young people about their concerns and hopes for the world. Youth from both dioceses are especially invited, but this special joint event is open to all.

At a specially scheduled meeting on Aug. 18, the Diocesan Council: Approved clergy housing allowances.

Reviewed a draft of the proposed diocesan mission strategy and provided feedback.

At its Sept. 10 meeting, held at Trinity Church in Concord, the Diocesan Council:

Reviewed the latest draft of the proposed diocesan mission strategy.

Heard a proposal for evaluating the mission strategy once it is approved by Diocesan Convention.

Heard a report from the Budget Committee chair, the Rev. Stephen Voysey, on the proposed 2017 diocesan budget.

Voted to adopt the proposed mission strategy for proposal to Diocesan Convention.

Agreed on the process by which members of the Phase IV Mission Strategy Implementation Organizing Team would be nominated and elected.

Voted to adopt the Phase IV Mission Strategy Implementation Organizing Team charter.

Voted to accept the recommendation of the Assessment Coordinating Committee to lower the 2017 assessments for 16 parishes by a total of \$75,000.

Heard an update on Diocesan Convention nominations, resolutions and proposed amendments to the diocesan Constitution and Canons.

Heard that the Executive Committee participated in a Visions, Inc., training over the summer; voted to adopt the Visions, Inc., guidelines as its own in members' work with one another; and to review said guidelines annually.
