Exploring a call? Register by Jan. 15 for Ministry Discernment Conference	Online registration is open, here, until Jan. 15 for the Ministry Discernment Conference on <i>Saturday, Feb. 4, 8:30 a.m2:30 p.m.</i> , at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston. (Snow date is Feb. 11. Check www.diomass.org for announcement.) The conference, offered by the bishops and the Commission on Ministry, provides an in-depth look at the 2017 Ministry Discernment Handbook and gives potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts and to explore whether their call is to ordained ministry or committed lay ministry. Any person considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2017 is required to attend the conference, along with sponsoring priest and at least one member of the parish discernment committee. Discernment committees, one member of which must be a member of the vestry, are appointed by the sponsoring priest and should be named before the conference so that as many members as wish to may attend. Inquirers are also encouraged to bring their spouses or partners to the conference. <i>FOR INFORMATION: The Rev. 	• There will be two Friday-Saturday pre-Confirmation retreats : <i>March 17-18 and April 7-8</i> at the Barbara C. Harris Camp and Conference Center in Greenfield, N.H. Confirmands and their mentors will gather to meet other young people and explore their call to Confirmation, its promise and challenge. The retreats are led by the members of the Diocesan Youth Council who will lead small groups and give reflections on their own spiritual journeys. Advance retreat registration is required. CHURCHWIDE:	 The Standing Commission on Liturgy and Music (SCLM) plans to present the 2018 General Convention with four options regarding the possible revision of the 1979 Book of Common Prayer, according to a Dec. 6 media release from the Episcopal Church's Office of Public Affairs. The options, discussed in detail on the SCLM's blog, are: revision of the prayer book beginning after the 2018 General Convention; creation of a book or books of alternative services beginning after the 2018 General Convention, with no accompanying revision of the prayer book; a postponement of the decision on the prayer book and supplemental resources until the completion of a churchwide conversation on liturgical theology and practice during the 2018-2021 triennium; or, step back from liturgical revision and a commitment to exploring the theology of the current prayer book in greater depth. Resolution A169 of the 2015 General Convention directed the SCLM to prepare a plan for comprehensive prayer book revision and present that plan to the next General Convention.
	• Episcopal Church Foundation (ECF) fellowship applications for 2017 are now available, here. Emerging scholars and ministry leaders are invited to apply. Applicants are asked to describe how they will be developing the next generation of leaders for the Episcopal Church, whether in the context of academia, a local congregation, through a churchwide initiative or in another setting. New awards range up to \$15,000 for the first year and are renewable for an additional two years. Training is required of all clergy, diocesan employees and congregational employees, and is also highly recommended for all serving in a congregation on a regular basis.

Heard a report from the mission hub program director, Jin Min Lee, on the South Shore Mission Hub and overall hub funding.

Voted to increase the mission hub program director's position from 20 hours per week to 30 hours per week, effective Jan. 1.

Voted to approve clergy housing allowances for 2017.

Voted to change the assessment for the Church of Our Saviour in Arlington from \$12,927 to \$9,893.84, due to an error in a previous parochial report.

Voted that \$50,000 for expenses related to mission strategy come from the Fund for Congregational Vitality.

Heard an Executive Committee report that included the vote taken at its Dec. 1, 2016, meeting to forgive charges that the diocese would have incurred during the Cathedral Church of St. Paul's merger with the former Church of St. John the Evangelist in Boston.
