Program Overview

What's our story, and what does it mean in the world today? As churches and communities live in the midst of significant fragmentation, Deacons grapple with fundamental questions of how to live and work meaningfully and faithfully in these times of division and change. How do we best interpret the needs, concerns and hopes of a changing world and how do our individual stories affect that?

Heidi Shott, Canon for Communications and Social Justice in the Diocese

of Maine, will introduce us to a variety of ways to tell the stories of the world as we explore what Phyllis Tickle has identified as the emerging power of narrative over logic. Together with Bishops Laura Ahrens (CT), Ian Douglas (CT), Steve Lane (ME), and Tom Shaw (MA) we will explore how deacons—with a foot in church and world—engage in these vital conversations.

Heidi will also moderate discussion with communications officers from other New England dio-



ceses so we can harness the power of sacred story, our own stories and the world's stories to be effective communicators and change agents. Small group sessions with Deacon leaders from across New England will provide firsthand introduction to a variety of diaconal ministries.

Our Presenter

Heidi Shott is Canon for Communications and Social Justice in the Episcopal Diocese of Maine. She is currently the Vice Chair of the Standing Commission on Communications and Information Technology, and served as Chair of the Episcopal Life Board of Governors from 2002 to 2006. She has also worked on the Office of Communication's video

news team for the past two General Conventions, hosting "The Daily Wrap" in Anaheim in 2009.

Heidi has written for many church publications and is a monthly columnist for Episcopal Cafe. She keeps the blog www.heidoville.com where she hangs essays about trying to live a life of faith in a complicated

world from a small town in Maine. Helping God's people share their stories of faith with the world is **her** ministry passion. With her husband Scott, a hospital administrator, and their 16 year-old twin sons, Martin and Colin, she makes her home in Damariscotta Mills where she roots for the Red Sox even when they lose.

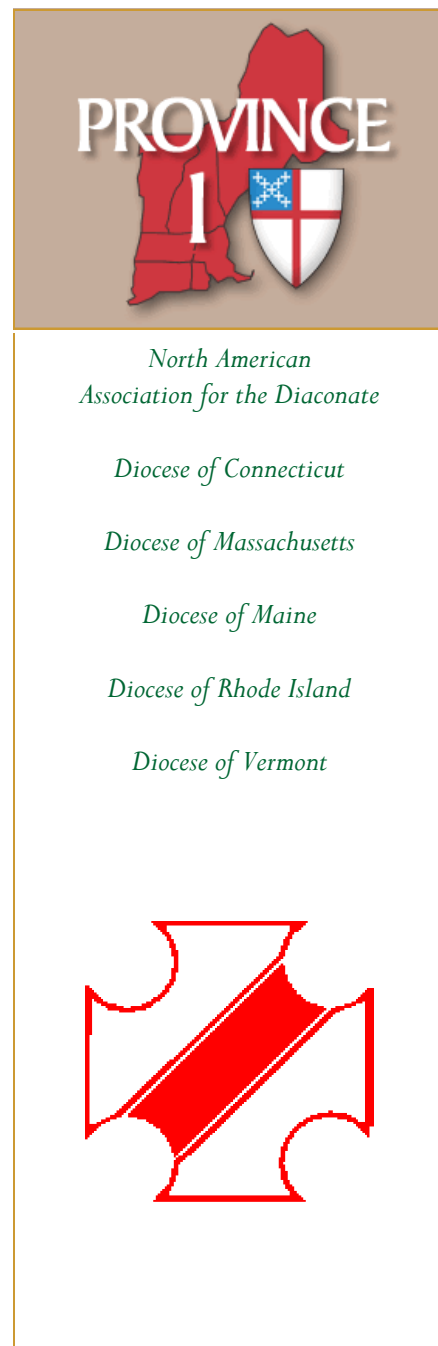
