Gates as the 16th bishop of the Diocese of Massachusetts, to take place on *Saturday, Sept. 13* at Boston University's Agganis Arena (925 Commonwealth Avenue) in Boston, with processions beginning at 10:30 a.m. A reception will follow the service.

Applications for the 2014-2015 Diocesan Youth Council (DYC) and Youth Leadership Academy (YLA) are now available at www.diomassyouth.org/resources.htm. DYC applications are due Wednesday, Sept. 3 and YLA applications are due Tuesday, Sept. 16.

Young people entering 10th, 11th or 12th grade are eligible to apply for DYC, which represents the youth of the diocese with voice and vote at Diocesan Convention and serves the youth of the diocese by planning and running diocesan youth events. YLA is a leadership training and spiritual formation program for young people entering 9th or 10th grade. Through YLA, each participant creates and leads a self-chosen project to connect her or his home parish and the wider community.

• The Episcopal Church's **Joint Nominating Committee for the Election of the Presiding Bishop** continues its work in
preparation for the election of the next presiding bishop at General
Convention next summer. The committee **has published three essays designed to begin a discussion about the election** (click
on links to access essays): one on the <u>timeline and steps in the</u>
<u>election process</u>; another on the <u>current role and responsibilities</u>
of the <u>presiding bishop</u>; and a third on the <u>evolving role of the</u>
<u>presiding bishop and the changing selection process</u>.

• The Episcopal Church's **clergy disciplinary canons (Title IV)** stipulate that each diocese provide for and publicize methods and means of reporting information concerning offenses.

Under Title IV all matters are reported to an intake officer, initiating a process toward resolution through pastoral care; mediation; an agreement with the bishop; an investigation that may lead to a hearing; or any combination of these. Anyone may contact the diocesan intake officer to report concerns about the behavior of a member of the clergy (bishops, priests, deacons).
