Registration is open for Feb. 7 Ministry Discernment Conference

The Ministry Discernment Conference offered by the bishops and the Commission on Ministry will be held on *Saturday, Feb. 7, 2015, 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.*, at Trinity Church (Copley Square) in Boston. (The snow date is Feb. 14. Please check www.diomass.org for announcement.) The conference provides an in-depth look at the 2015 Ministry Discernment Handbook, and gives potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts and to explore whether their call is to ordained ministry or committed lay ministry.

Any person considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2015 is required to attend the conference, along with his or her sponsoring priest and at least one member of the Parish Discernment Committee. Discernment Committees are appointed by the sponsoring priest and should be named before the conference so that as many members as wish to may attend. One member of the Discernment Committee must be a member of the vestry. Inquirers are also encouraged to bring their spouses or partners to the conference.
