The Reverend Douglas Anderson engaged in Conduct Unbecoming a Member of the Clergy in violation of Title IV, Canon IV.1(h)(9) of the Canons of the Episcopal Church.

misrepresented his behavior toward Ms. He falsely denied having oral sex with her					
and falsely denied sending her a love letter and airline tickets to visit with him in Boston on					
Valentine's Day.
