Join MA Episcopalians at Mother's Day Walk for Peace

April 21 Global Mission Summit: "Partnering with God" Massachusetts Episcopalians are invited to join Bishop Alan M. Gates and the B-PEACE for Jorge Campaign again this year in making a public witness against gun violence by walking together in the Mother's Day Walk for Peace on *Sunday, May 13*.

This annual pledge walk is sponsored by the Louis D. Brown Peace Institute and is a fundraiser for the institute's support of families affected by murder and its efforts to create more peaceful communities.

Walkers can start off together at 8 a.m. from Town Field Park (1520 Dorchester Avenue) in Dorchester, or join the walk at the second entry point at 9:45 a.m. at Madison Park High School (75 Malcolm X Boulevard, Roxbury Crossing). The walk concludes with a rally at Boston City Hall Plaza at 11 a.m.

Walkers can get ready by signing up, seeking pledges and spreading the word. The Jubilee Global Mission Committee's Global Mission Summit, to take place on *Saturday, April 21, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.*, at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Boston, will be "an opportunity to explore God's expectations of our partnerships in a number of different contexts and share our own experiences of best practices as partners of God," according to organizers.

Whether new to mission engagement or experienced, participants will hear from thought-provoking speakers, take part in interactive workshops, have time for networking and participate in a joyous international celebration of the Eucharist.

Scheduled speakers include the Rev. Canon Petero A. N. Sabune, the re-entry chaplain and director of the master's degree program at Sing Sing, the maximum-security prison in Ossining, N.Y., and former Africa partnership officer for the Episcopal Church; and the Rev. Dr. Christopher Duraisingh, former Episcopal Divinity School faculty member and director of the Commission on World Mission and Evangelism of the World Council of Churches.

• A new **Episcopal Evangelism Toolkit** is available online for congregations, dioceses, groups and individuals, for use in exploring evangelism and growing capacity to share the good news of God in Christ far and wide. The toolkit is organized in four sections, covering the practical theology of evangelism, "Evangelism 101" workshop materials, exploring evangelism through social media and a "Beloved Community StorySharing" guidebook. TRAINING & LEARNING:

• "Intro to Wisdom Christianity": This free workshop, on Saturday, April 7, 9 a.m.-12:30 p.m., at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston, will introduce core interspiritual contemplative practices — meditation, sacred chant, embodied prayer and sacred reading—led by the Rev. Steven Bonsey, a student of Cynthia Bourgeault's Wisdom Schools. The workshop is co-sponsored by Wisdom & Money, Contemplative Outreach of Boston and the Cathedral Church of St Paul.

An Episcopal Relief & Development disaster preparedness training will be offered on Saturday, April 14, 9 a.m.-2 p.m., at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston. The training will focus on the disaster preparedness planning process and will facilitate the development of a ministry that helps congregations anticipate and prepare for local, unexpected disastrous events, as well as how to respond effectively to natural disasters. The session will explore how members of congregations can create and become familiar with various models and approaches, what resources and tools are available, and what supports and structures already exist to use when doing this important work. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis and participants will be notified of their acceptance no later than April 27.

• A **Safe Church Training event, open to all**, takes place on <u>Saturday, May 12</u> at St. John's Church (23 High Street) in Sharon. Click on the date link to register online.

This training is designed to increase awareness regarding sexual misconduct and abuse of power, to outline steps toward preventing abuse and to offer ways to intervene when misconduct occurs. The diocese is committed to healthy church environments and needs the shared wisdom and experience of everyone to make them so.
