Bishop Alan M. Gates has announced the recent appointment New deans appointed of two new deans. The Rev. Sarah Robbins-Cole, Rector of St. Michael's Church in Holliston, has begun as the dean of the Concord River Deanery, succeeding the Rev. Kate Malin, who served for three years. The Rev. Malia Crawford, Rector of the Church of Our Saviour in Arlington, will begin Aug. 1 as the dean of the Alewife Deanery, succeeding the Very Rev. Amy McCreath, who served a brief term and will remain in the Council of Deans in her new role as dean of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul. These appointments follow those of two other new deans announced at Diocesan Convention and effective following that event: The Rev. Terry Pannell, Rector of St. Mary's Church in Provincetown, as the dean of the Cape and Islands Deanery, succeeding the Rev. Deborah Warner, who served for three years; and the Rev. Matthew Cadwell, Rector of Emmanuel Church in Wakefield, as dean of the Mystic Valley Deanery, succeeding the Rev. John Clarke, who served for seven years. Episcopal Divinity School (EDS) announced last year its move from **Deconsecration of EDS** Cambridge to New York City to affiliate with Union Theological chapel set for June 8 Seminary. In light of this move and the pending sale of its property in Cambridge, including the chapel, a service of deconsecration will be held on Friday, June 8, with an informal story-sharing gathering at 3 p.m., followed at 4 p.m. by a service of Holy Eucharist with an Order of Deconsecration. Bishop Alan M. Gates will officiate. A reception will follow the service. RSVP by e-mail to <u>AttendingDeconsecration@eds.edu</u>. EDS is not able to arrange for reserved parking spaces around the campus, though parking is available in the Harvard Square area. Those interested in participating in a choir for the occasion should e-mail Ellen Oak at <u>ellen.f.oak@gmail.com</u>. A rehearsal is scheduled from 1 to 2:30 p.m. on June 8, the day of the service. Join Bishop Gayle E. Harris and the Rev. Manny Faria for "Encounters in the Holy Land," a mission pilgrimage in Israel and Palestine, *Sept. 28-Oct. 10.* The mission pilgrimage will combine visits to holy sites with opportunities to learn about active mission in the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem through its school, healthcare and peacemaking ministries.

The deadline for registering is June 20.

The group will meet three times before the trip for orientation and community building. Estimated cost is \$4,100 per person (double occupancy), with all payments due by July 15.

The Boston University School of Theology has received a **NOTES:** \$1.5-million grant to create an **innovation hub to foster creative vocational reflection**, and it is now accepting applications from congregations interested in participating in its resulting "Creative Callings" project. Up to 20 New England congregations will be accepted to participate in the hub. Participation will involve two full-day gatherings for congregational teams at Boston University and monthly smaller group cluster conversations around shared interests. Participating congregations will be eligible to apply for grant funding at the end of the first year to support innovative ministries that they are developing around vocation. Applications are due by Sunday, July 15. Congregations will be notified by Monday, July 30, with the first hub event scheduled on Thursday, August 23. Episcopal Migration Ministries and the Episcopal Church's **CHURCHWIDE:** Office of Government Relations is hosting a one-hour free Webinar, "Our 1939 Moment: Continuing the Legacy of Welcome," on Monday, June 18 at 4 p.m. Presented as part of the World Refugee Day observance on June 20, the Webinar will be a conversation about the history and present of the Episcopal Church's legacy of refugee welcome. "Our present moment is not so unlike our past," Allison Duvall, Episcopal Migration Ministries Manager for Church Relations and Engagement, said in a news release. "In the 1930's and 1940's, the church was galvanized to stand for refugees fleeing Nazi atrocities in Europe. Today, over 22.5 million children of God are refugees, fleeing terror, persecution, violence and war. We are called, at this moment, to stand for them."
