Last call for Diocesan Convention nominations, resolutions

Friday, Sept. 7 is the deadline for submission of nomination papers, resolutions, proposed amendments to the diocesan constitution and canons, applications for admission as a parish or mission, required reports from diocesan committees and applications for display space at the convention. The 233rd Annual Convention of the Diocese of Massachusetts will take place on *Saturday, Nov. 3* at the Cape Cod Resort and Conference Center in Hyannis, with an optional dinner on *Friday evening, Nov. 2* celebrating the 30th anniversary of Bishop Barbara C. Harris's historic election. Registration opens in early October.

Second of three regional canons named

Bishop Alan M. Gates has announced the appointment of the Rev. Kelly A. O'Connell to serve as regional canon for the Southern Region, comprising the South Shore, Taunton River, Mt. Hope-Buzzards Bay, and Cape and Island deaneries. O'Connell will be relocating from the Diocese of Los Angeles, where she has served for the past six years as the rector of St. Stephen's Church in Santa Clarita. Her anticipated start date is Oct. 1. She will serve together with the Rev. Martha L. Hubbard, who was appointed in July to serve as regional canon for the Northern and Western Region, and a third canon for the Central Region, soon to be announced.

Each of the three regional canons will be responsible for lay leadership support and development; transition ministry with congregations and clergy involved in search processes for new ordained leadership; and clergy wellness and family support.

NOTES:

- **Updated remarriage guidelines:** The diocesan guidelines for clergy seeking permission to officiate at a marriage of a divorced person have been revised and went into effect Sept. 1, as previously announced at the diocesan Clergy Conference. The application and forms are available by request, from clergy only, to Bishop Gayle E. Harris's office. Applications to officiate at remarriages of divorced lay people should be submitted to Harris's office; clergy remarriage applications should be submitted to Bishop Alan M. Gates's office.

Much in the application and requirements remains the same, with a few important differences:

- Completed forms must be received no later than 45 days before the proposed remarriage (previously it was 30 days).
- A period of six months must have passed from the time of the final civil/government divorce decree and the proposed remarriage (the time period was not clearly stated previously).
- One letter is required from both parties stating the failure of the previous marriage(s), care of children (if any) and their intentions and reasons for marriage in the church (previously two letters were required, one from each of the parties).

By tradition and canon, the reporting requirements are developed by the House of Deputies' Committee on the State of the Church, using a form approved by the church's Executive Council.

The newly posted documents include “fast facts” and trends; baptized membership, average Sunday attendance (ASA), statistical totals and average pledging by province and diocese, as well as financial and ASA totals by diocese.

- **Volunteer teacher training:** ProGente Connections, the Metrowest Mission Hub, is an ecumenical collaborative of churches and community organizations that provides beginner and intermediate English classes to the Brazilian community. More than 1,000 students are on the waitlist in this region. ProGente's curriculum is designed to provide students with language skills, but also to break down cross-cultural barriers. Volunteer teachers must be able to commit two hours per week to ESL instruction. Teachers work in teams of two, supported by a professional staff. Small class sizes (15 students maximum) and easy-to-use materials and training make this position accessible to most, whether they have a teaching background or not. Textbooks, curricula, resources and training are provided to all, and much of it is available online.
