### Registration is open for annual Ministry Discernment Conference

The annual Ministry Discernment Conference offered by the bishops and the Commission on Ministry will be held on *Saturday*, *Feb. 2, 8:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m.*, at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston. (The snow date is Feb. 9. Please check <a href="www.diomass.org">www.diomass.org</a> for announcement.) The conference provides an in-depth look at the 2019 Ministry Discernment Handbook, and gives potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts and to explore whether their call is to ordained ministry or committed lay ministry. Online registration is required and is open through Jan. 21, <a href="here">here</a>.

Any person considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2019 is required to attend the conference, along with his or her sponsoring priest and at least one member of the Parish Discernment Committee. Discernment committees, one member of which must be a member of the vestry, are appointed by the sponsoring priest and should be named before the conference so that as many members as wish to may attend. Inquirers are also encouraged to bring their spouses or partners to the conference. FOR INFORMATION: The Rev. ## Task force on young adult engagement being formed for 2019

One of this year's Diocesan Convention actions was adoption of a resolution calling for the convening of a task force "to examine successful models of engagement of adults in their 20s and 30s within and beyond the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts." The task force is now being formed, with hopes for an initial meeting in January to develop a plan of action, likely to include researching successful parish-based, regional and diocesan-based strategies as well as
