# Mission strategy review survey coming in new year

# Registration is open for Ministry Discernment Conference

At the beginning of 2021, the diocesan mission strategy team will be soliciting engagement and feedback on the current mission strategy, adopted in 2016. Per diocesan canons, the current mission strategy is up for review in 2021—an opportunity to make revisions or additions for the 2021 Diocesan Convention. The team will be distributing a survey, as well as ways to engage with the content of the mission strategy in light of the current pandemic. Be on the lookout for more information soon. Online registration is now open, <u>here</u>, for the annual Ministry Discernment Conference hosted by the Commission on Ministry, which will be held as a videoconference on *Saturday, Feb. 6, from 9 a.m.* to 1 p.m. The conference provides an in-depth look at the 2021 edition of the Ministry Discernment Handbook, and gives potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts as they consider whether their call is to ordained ministry or committed lay ministry.

Any person considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2021 is required to attend the conference, along with a sponsoring priest and at least one member of the Parish Discernment Committee. Inquirers are also encouraged to bring their spouses or partners to the conference.

"Space for Jesus" Online Advent Quiet Day: The dioceses of Massachusetts and Western Massachusetts are co-sponsoring an online Advent Quiet Day on Saturday, Dec. 12, 10 a.m.-12 p.m., led by the Rev. Dr. Margaret Bullitt-Jonas, Missioner for Creation Care in the Diocese of Western Massachusetts and Southern New England Conference, United Church of Christ. Participants will be invited to step away from daily tasks and concerns in order to listen with full attention to the Spirit's movement within. The time will include presentations and guided meditations, with options for solitary reflection (indoors or out) or small group conversation. This online retreat is open to all, free of charge. "Discerning My Path" is a new lay discernment opportunity **launching in January 2021** for anyone yearning for a deeper relationship with God and wondering about what they have to offer the world and how to listen deeply enough to hear God's desire. The Diocese of Massachusetts joins other New England dioceses in Province I in partnering with Bexley-Seabury Seminary to offer this six-month lay discernment program. In addition to monthly online meetings in small groups, participants will engage with spiritual reading, videos and articles on discernment, spiritual practices and the ministry of the baptized. • Congregational Consultants host series of Zoom calls on the practical aspects of congregational leadership: These will include topics of interest to vestries and particularly to wardens and treasurers. The upcoming session, led by congregational consultant and parish auditor Terry Robinson, will focus on "What to Do in December and January" in terms of **year-end financial and** closing matters, and will be offered on *Saturday, Dec. 5* (register online here) from 9 to 10 a.m.

January's session, on *Tuesday, Jan. 12, at 9 a.m.*, led by the Rev. Robert Edson, will focus on **annual meetings** (register online here). Find out required and suggested content, administrative considerations and tips for making your meeting useful, efficient and fun. This call is recommended for those who are grappling with how to handle the annual meeting in the age of COVID-19 and those who just want to fine tune their usual meetings. These sessions will be recorded for later access.

• The **Working Group on Adolescent Mental Health** plans to offer a series of **pre-recorded sermons** that any congregation or youth group in the diocese can use on the *Sundays from Jan. 17* to Feb. 14. A diverse group of preachers from around the diocese will prepare sermons for adolescents that will also be appropriate for adults listening along. The goal is to center and support young people and speak to them pastorally during a very challenging and isolating time. Access information will be announced. FOR INFORMATION: The Very Rev. • **80th General Convention postponed to 2022:** The Episcopal Church's 80th General Convention, the church's triennial governance gathering that was to have taken place this upcoming summer, has been postponed to *July 7-14, 2022*, in Baltimore, Md., according to a Nov. 20 announcement from Presiding Bishop Michael B. Curry and President of the House of Deputies the Rev. Gay Clark Jennings. Read their letter <u>here</u>.

In preparation, the presiding officers announced, an online convocation of worship and prayer will be held in summer 2021, and legislative committees will be appointed in 2021 and charged with beginning their work virtually. An online election will also be held in 2021 to choose members of the Joint Nominating Committee for the Election of the Presiding Bishop, so that that group will have ample time to complete its work before the 81st General Convention in 2024, when the church will choose a new presiding bishop.

• **Special 2020 Parochial Report form:** The form for the 2020 Parochial Report is now viewable on the General Convention website in English <u>here</u>, in Spanish <u>here</u> and in French <u>here</u>.

The filing site will be live on *Jan. 2, 2021*. Parochial Reports will be due to diocesses by *March 1*, and to the General Convention Office by *May 1*.

Releasing the new form at this time offers congregational leaders time to review the new questions and to begin gathering the information needed to complete the report. The 2020 report includes a new narrative section, which invites congregations to reflect on the opportunities and challenges encountered in the midst of the pandemic. Also new are questions about online worship and questions on the impact the pandemic has had on congregational life and finances. The report also asks about the congregation's involvement in racial justice and reconciliation work.

The 2020 Parochial Report, along with an updated Diocesan Report, was developed by the House of Deputies State of the Church Committee and approved by Executive Council in October.

• The Church Pension Group (CPG) has released its **2019 Episcopal Clergy Compensation Report** (<u>www.cpg.org/research</u>), which offers an in-depth look at demographic and geographic differences in clergy compensation across the church. The report includes compensation categorized by region, age, gender, employment status, parish size and operating revenue. For the first time, this year's report also breaks down data by gender at a diocesan level and provides compensation figures for all international clergy. The report was updated to include an interactive online version with a map-based graphic interface to allow viewers a faster and easier way to access information.

**Be a part of the picture:** In preparation for its 2020 report, CPG is now collecting data on race, ethnicity, gender identity and sexual orientation from all clergy. These efforts will allow it to build out a more robust report and assist the church in understanding how different clergy groups are treated in terms of compensation. • "Masks On, Masks Off" Virtual Retreat for Youth: Young people across the diocese are invited to join for a half-day online gathering on *Sunday*, *Dec. 13, 2-7 p.m.*, to connect with peers through deep conversations, prayer and games.

From 2 to 4 p.m., small groups, led by members of the Diocesan Youth Council, will talk about the masks we all wear these days: the ones we put on to protect each other, and the ones we put up to hide how we really feel. Participants will also have a chance to talk about the impact that the pandemic is having and share ideas for mental health and self-care. The retreat will break for an hour and resume at 5 p.m. for fun games, ending the evening with a short service of Compline. Participants can choose one session or the other, or both.
