### Nov. 12-13 Diocesan Convention weekend events are open to all

Ministry Discernment Conference for inquirers set for Feb. 5 The annual Diocesan Convention takes place *Friday-Saturday*, *Nov. 12-13*, under the theme "Members One of Another." Friday's full line-up of plenary and break-out sessions, worship and evening keynote program is open to all. Convention's annual business sessions follow on Saturday; delegates and clergy will participate via Zoom, with a livestream available for those who wish to observe the proceedings. **All convention Zoom sessions and the Saturday livestream will be presented via a virtual event management platform, so pre-registration will be necessary to access them. Find registration <u>here</u>.** Visitor registration to access the Saturday livestream will remain open that day. All convention-related questions may be e-mailed to <u>convention@diomass.org</u>.

Registration will open online in December for the **annual Ministry Discernment Conference** offered by the bishops and the Commission on Ministry, to be held on *Saturday, Feb. 5, 9 a.m.-1 p.m.*, and currently planned as an in-person event at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston. (The snow date is Feb. 12.)

The conference will provide an in-depth look at the 2022 edition of the Ministry Discernment Handbook and gives potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts as they consider whether their call is to ordained ministry or committed lay ministry. Any person considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2022 is required to attend the conference, along with a sponsoring priest and at least one member of the Parish Discernment Committee. *FOR INFORMATION: The Rev.
