Listening sessions on reparations coming up this spring

The 2021 Diocesan Convention resolution "Charting the Long Road Towards Reparations" calls on the diocese to commit 2022 as a year of study, gathering and sharing stories and discernment. To help begin this process, the Reparations Subcommittee of the Racial Justice Commission is organizing a series of **regional** "Reparations Listening Gatherings" to take place beginning in late April via Zoom. These gatherings will be designed to create space for listening to all throughout the diocese as they share their thoughts and feelings regarding reparations. More information will be forthcoming.

This year's "Practicing Truth" Lenten Preaching Series at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Boston will run alongside the "What is Truth?" Lenten study series offered this year by the Racial Justice Commission. Join one another at the cathedral at 12:15 p.m. on Thursdays in Lent, March 3-April 7, to hear the sermon in person and stay for a light lunch and conversation with the preacher, or join by livestream through the cathedral's website. • The clergy of the diocese are invited to a service of **Renewal of Ordination Vows and Blessing of Chrism** on *Holy Tuesday, April 12*, at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Boston.

The bishops will lead the same service at two times, *noon and* 5:30 p.m., to accommodate varying clergy schedules. The 5:30 p.m. service will be livestreamed at <a href="https://www.stpaulboston.org">www.stpaulboston.org</a>.

Boxed meals are available for order for \$10 as part of the registration process, for those who would like to stay following. Advance registration is required, <a href="here">here</a>, to ensure good planning for observing whatever diocesan COVID-19 protocols are in place in early April.

• Due to the downward trend in key COVID indicators, physical distancing restrictions have been lifted on in-person participation at this year's diocesan **Clergy Conference**, to be held *Monday*, *April 25-Wednesday*, *April 27* at the Babson Executive Conference Center in Wellesley. **Registration is open**, <a href="here">here</a>, for virtual, overnight and commuter participation. Should conditions change, capacity adjustments may be necessary to reinstitute physical distancing. # **GRANTS & LOANS:**

• An updated document for 2022 **summarizing diocesan grant and loan programs** is available <u>here</u>. Many accept applications on a rolling basis; programs with upcoming deadlines for letters of intent or applications include <u>Congregational Development Grants</u> and <u>Sustainable Development Grants</u> (in March) and <u>Mission Tithe Relationship Grants</u> (in April).

Recipients of a 2021 deanery House of Mercy or Sending Serving Grant need to submit a brief year-end report on their ministries, required before they are eligible to receive deanery grant funds in subsequent years. Recipients should use this opportunity to showcase their project and good stewardship of funds. The report form is available <a href="here">here</a> and is due by Oct. 1. - The diocesan budget for 2022 sets aside \$44,397 for initial **funding for new mission initiatives**. The Mission Initiatives Committee of Diocesan Council is responsible for making recommendations regarding congregations, programs and chaplaincies that receive this funding and invites applications by *May 1*. Please note that priority will be given to under-resourced congregations and newly initiated programs for funding during this budget year.
- Clergy children scholarship grants: Children of clergy canonically resident or licensed in the Diocese of Massachusetts (and their widows/widowers) are eligible to apply for scholarship grants for undergraduate degree programs.
