Earlier-than-usual submission deadline: **Friday, Sept. 2**

"By This They Will Know You: The Call of Love in Our Time and Place" has been announced as the theme for the 237th annual Diocesan Convention, to take place *Friday-Saturday*, *Oct. 28-29* at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel Boston North Shore in Danvers.

Early plans include Friday afternoon sessions focused on pressing questions of discipleship, and an evening dinner with a hymn/spirituals sing. Business sessions and the convention Eucharist will take place on Saturday.

The deadline for submitting all materials will be *Friday*, *Sept. 2*. This will be the final day to submit materials to the Convention Office, including nomination forms for elected positions, resolution submission forms and written reports.

All congregations are reminded to submit their congregational leadership reports, including certification of lay delegates, to make sure that their convention delegation will receive upcoming convention communications. Questions may be e-mailed to convention@diomass.org.

- In July 2021 the new **online safe church training platform**<u>Praesidium Academy</u> launched with the first few in a new series of nine training modules titled "Safe Church, Safe Communities."

As of Holy Week, three **new modules** titled "Pastoral Relationships, Inclusion, and Power and Relationships" went live. With one more module pending, the diocese will soon be rolling out a revised chart of "Who Should Take What" to help guide congregations toward compliance with the policies for the protection of children and youth and for vulnerable adults developed by the General Convention Task Force to Develop Model Anti-Sexual Harassment Policies and Safe Church Training and adopted by the diocese in 2019.

To further assist both seasoned practitioners and new personnel with the use of the new online platform to provide safe church training for clergy, staff and volunteers on the congregational level, **Praesidium Academy is presenting a series of webinars for administrators**, to cover how to navigate the admin dashboard and provide overviews of user management and reporting. • As the **80th General Convention of The Episcopal Church** nears, legislative committee work is already well underway, and **all** are invited to participate in online hearings. This is how:

Review the Legislative Committee Meetings Calendar, here, to learn about upcoming hearings or meetings and the resolutions to be discussed at each, then go to the Legislative Committee Meeting Registration page, here, where you can choose your preferred language and register to either observe or testify at a hearing. (Note that registration requests must be received at least two business days prior to the meeting date in order to be processed.)

Everyone's presence and testimony are invaluable as a way to incorporate the wisdom of the wider church into the convention's deliberations. <u>General Convention</u> takes place *July 7-14* in Baltimore.

• Three years after launching <u>Sacred Ground</u>, a dialogue series on race, racism and whiteness, The Episcopal Church's Racial Reconciliation and Justice Team has released a comprehensive <u>evaluation report</u>, updated curriculum and resources, and expanded licensing that invites people in other denominations or faiths to start their own Sacred Ground circles. At its March 17 meeting, the Diocesan Council:

Welcomed the Rev. David Milam to Diocesan Council as a deanery representative for the Taunton River Deanery.

Heard a report from the Treasurer's Office about the proposed 2023 assessment formula.

At its April 21 meeting, the Diocesan Council:

Voted to approve the following 2023 assessment formula:

Resolved, where BASE for 2023 is equal to line A ("Normal Operating Income") from the 2020 Parochial Report, less line 13 ("Outreach from Operating Budget"), that the 2023 assessment for parishes be calculated as follows:

BASE between:

0.50% of BASE
\$250 plus 7% of BASE-50,000
\$3750 plus 12.70% of BASE-100,000
\$3750 plus 13.10% of BASE-100,000
\$3750 plus 13.25% of BASE-100,000
9\$3750 plus 13.50% of BASE-100,000
\$3750 plus 14.50% of BASE-100,000

For a mission, the 2023 assessment is two-thirds of the amount calculated above.
