Bishops offer COVID guidelines as fall church events resume

Online registration is open for Diocesan Convention, to take place *Friday-Saturday, Oct. 28-29* at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel in Danvers. Convention is open to all in the diocesan community and includes non-business programming on Friday exploring this year's theme, "By This They Will Know You: The Call of Love in Our Time and Place." The registration link, hotel reservation information, COVID precautions that will be implemented during the convention and more are at <u>www.diomass.org/diocesan-convention-2022</u>.

Important upcoming dates for voting members include: An **open comment period** to collect feedback on proposed resolutions runs *Sept. 9-14*, with a **Zoom discussion on resolutions** scheduled for *Tuesday, Sept. 13 at 7 p.m.* (An online feedback form will also be available.) **Pre-Convention Forums** via Zoom are on:

- Wednesday, Oct. 5, 7-8:30 p.m.: Central Region
- Thursday, Oct. 6, 7-8:30 p.m.: Northern and Western Region
- Friday, Oct. 7, 2-3:30 p.m.: All Regions
- Tuesday, Oct. 11, 7-8:30 p.m.: Southern Region

To prepare for these forums, pre-recorded video reports will be available to view ahead of time, either on demand or with others via Zoom during one of **two viewing nights** scheduled on *Monday*, *Oct. 3 at 7 p.m.* and *Thursday*, *Oct. 6 at 7 p.m.*

With the approach of fall and the resumption of many events in the churches of the diocese, the bishops issued COVID-19 recommendations and requirements on Aug. 29. Find them <u>here</u>. The bishops note that while community risk levels in Massachusetts have been low for several months, they continue to urge caution in church gatherings, especially for those who are at greater risk of severe disease from COVID-19 infection, and continue to support congregatinal leadership who conclude that, in their local context, more restrictive measures on gatherings need to be maintained.

Should there be a significant resurgence of COVID-19 infections in the region, a return to more restrictive safety practices may be necessary. At diocesan events, including the <u>Diocesan Convention</u> in October, safety protocols will be observed to minimize the risk of transmission.
