Racial Justice Commission opens REDI Assessment to all

Spread the word and participate: www.diomass.org/REDI-Assessment

The <u>Racial Justice Commission</u> has launched a Racial Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (REDI) Assessment and invites all people in the diocese to take part. The online survey takes 30-35 minutes to complete, and is something that people across the diocese can do to move the diocesan community closer to becoming Beloved Community. Please share word of this opportunity with members of your congregation or worshiping community.

The REDI survey measures proxies for race-based discrimination, diversity, inclusion and equity in faith-based institutional settings. The results will help in gaining an understanding of the level of awareness and knowledge of racial equity culture and will help gauge perceptions of the environment for decision makers, staff and community members.

REDI survey results are 100 percent confidential and are reported only in the aggregate, in a continuum format, with suggested areas to develop based on a final REDI score. This assessment will be used as a baseline in 2022 and can be taken again in the future to measure progress toward race equity goals.

GRANTS & LOANS:

• United Thank Offering 2023 grant applications now available: Because the Diocese of Massachusetts may only submit one grant, it is recommended that those planning to submit an application contact Martha Gardner (as below) by *Friday*, *Dec. 2*. A diocesan committee needs time to review applications and make a recommendation to the bishop before the churchwide UTO deadline. All grant applications must be received by close of business to Martha Gardner on *Friday*, *Feb. 3*.

- The Mission Strategy Committee encourages congregations, organizations and networks in the Diocese of Massachusetts to apply for **Wicked Good Idea Microgrants**. There is a total of \$10,000 available for 2022; grants can be between \$200 and \$1,000. Find the application, with criteria and examples of mission strategy-related projects, here. - Compliance guidelines: To be eligible for grants or loans administered by the Diocese of Massachusetts, congregations must be in compliance with basic reporting requirements. Please review them and check on your congregation's compliance prior to submitting an application:
- Parochial Report (2022 report due March 1, 2023; if grant is awarded prior to March 1, the 2021 report suffices)
- Annual audit in process (2022 audit due Sept. 1, 2023; if award is prior to Sept. 1, the 2021 audit suffices)
- Annual Leadership Report including Safe Church Audit (2023 report due March 1, 2023; if award is prior to March 1, the 2022 report suffices)
- Annual Clergy Compensation Form needs to be updated and submitted to Clergy Pension Group
- Current on payments (<90 days in arrears) of annual assessment, diocesan loans, clergy pension and health premiums
- Diocesan grants that have a matching component may not include funds from other diocesan grants or the value of in-kind donations as part of their match. Matching grants must be matched by actual cash.

Funds will not be issued until compliance requirements have been satisfied; congregations not in compliance will be notified and have 60 days to address requirements before the award is withdrawn.
