• Anglican leaders call for global support of Diocese of Jerusalem's ministries as war intensifies [Episcopal News Service]: Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby has joined with Archbishop Hosam Naoum in issuing a global appeal for support of Anglican ministries in the Holy Land as the war between Israel and Hamas intensifies. Welby and Naoum issued parallel written statements on Oct. 24 lamenting the recent violence, including damage to an Anglican hospital in Gaza, while urging Anglicans to pray for and donate to the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem. They listed several global partners that are accepting donations on the diocese's behalf, including the American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem. Read more here.

- The Episcopal Church's Standing Commission on Structure, Governance, Constitution and Canons welcomes churchwide input as it continues to review and revise Title IV disciplinary canons related to clergy. Feedback and recommendations can be submitted via this online form by Nov. 15. In a statement from its October meeting, the commission explained that its "work and discussions focused primarily on invitations from the presiding bishop and the president of the House of Deputies to address significant concerns across The Episcopal Church about reported problems with disciplinary proceedings in which a bishop is the respondent, as well as additional issues with clergy disciplinary proceedings." - Clergy across The Episcopal Church are invited to participate in a national study, Exploring the Pandemic Impact on Congregations: Innovation Amidst and Beyond COVID-19. This survey is part of an **ongoing project to track congregational health** over the coming years. The study is being conducted in partnership with Hartford Institute for Religion Research, the Faith Communities Today (FACT) research initiative and many other denominations. This collaboration aims to provide clergy with helpful information about the changing nature of congregational life in the U.S. and ways to respond effectively.

• UTO invites 2024 annual grant applicants: The United Thank Offering (UTO) has announced the availability of its annual grants for 2024, focusing on projects that welcome and include "the stranger." Each diocese may only submit one grant application, so it is recommended that those planning to apply contact Martha Gardner (as below) by early December. A diocesan committee needs time to review applications and make a recommendation to the bishop before the churchwide UTO deadline of Jan. 19.
