Bishops call for Jerusalem Offering, prayer, advocacy & learning "As we enter into the sacred season of Advent, our hearts are heavy at the continuing devastation, trauma and grief in the Holy Land. We call upon all our people and congregations to pray fervently, and to participate in a special **Jerusalem Christmas Offering** along with opportunities for advocacy and learning," Bishop Alan Gates and Bishop Carol Gallagher said in a Nov. 30 letter to the diocese. The bishops ask congregations to conduct an ingathering according to their own timetable and method. Aggregated gifts, payable to the Diocese of Massachusetts and earmarked for Jerusalem Christmas Offering, may be sent to Jerusalem Christmas Offering, Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts, 138 Tremont Street, Boston MA 02111 through Jan. 6, when the ingathering will be forwarded through the American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem. Prompt attention needed for 2024 Leadership Report process soon to be underway	• Leadership Report process for 2024: As soon as possible in the new year is when congregations need to submit their annual Leadership Report which includes the Diocesan Convention Lay Delegate Certification Form. Congregations are asked to submit their report within 10 days of their annual meeting as required by diocesan canons (Canon 2.2) and no later than <i>Friday, March 1</i> . As there will be a bishop election on <i>May 18, 2024</i> , it's impera- tive that congregations submit delegate data in a timely man- ner. Be on the lookout for communiques regarding the leadership report process. The information provided through this process is critical to ensure that important diocesan information reaches con- gregations' current leaders in the upcoming year. <i>FOR INFORMATION: The Rev. Registration is open for 2024 Ministry Discernment Conference	Registration is now open for the <b>2024 Ministry Discernment</b> <b>Conference</b> offered by the bishops and the Commission on Minis- try, to be held online on <i>Saturday, Feb. 3 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.</i> This online conference will provide an in-depth look at the 2024 edition of the Ministry Discernment Handbook and give potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts as they consider whether their call is to ordained ministry. <b>Any person considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2024 should attend the conference</b> , along with a sponsoring priest and at least one member of the congrega- tion's discernment committee. Other potential members of discernment committees are also welcome, though it is hoped that the composition of the committee can grow and change with the insights gained at the conference. It is also hoped that sponsoring congregations will take advantage of <u>this anti-bias tool</u> either in assembling a discernment committee or by discernment committee members as they begin their work with an inquirer.
