2024 Bishops' Annual Appeal launches in Lent

March 10 suggested as Bishops' Annual Appeal Ingathering Sunday

Lenten devotional program offered jointly in MA & VT

Good Friday liturgical resources authorized for trial use

As the 2024 Bishops' Annual Appeal launches, the bishops invite everyone to join in deepening covenants formed as the Diocese of Massachusetts: A goal of \$200,000 has been set for the 2024 appeal, in support of shared mission as a diocesan community committed to being disciples of Jesus, seekers of justice and protectors of creation.

The bishops have asked clergy and wardens to promote the Bishops' Annual Appeal locally and to consider designating the fourth Sunday in Lent, March 10, as Bishops' Annual Appeal Ingathering Sunday. Materials are being mailed directly to church offices and also are available at www.diomass.org/bishops-appeal. FOR INFORMATION: The Rev. A joint Lenten-Easter devotional is being offered in the dioceses of Vermont and Massachusetts on the theme of "Baptism and Collaboration in the Body of Christ." It features lay, ordained and monastic voices reflecting on the season's daily Scripture readings and the various "Will you..." questions of the baptismal covenant. The devotional will be available for download for individual, small group or congregational use, and will be posted, along with additional Lenten program offerings, at www.diomass.org/Lent-2024.

In complement, weekly online worship and conversation gatherings will be hosted by the Diocese of Vermont's Green Mountain Online Abbey on Thursday evenings, Feb. 15, 22 and 29, March 7, 14 and 21, and April 4, from 5:45 to 7:45 p.m., via Zoom here. The bishops have authorized a set of resource materials for use **on Good Friday**, including a proposed liturgy for trial use and a translation of the Passion Gospel, available in English and Spanish. "Given the difficult history of Jewish-Christian relations and the contemporary rise in anti-Semitism, the ways in which Jews are portrayed in the Holy Week liturgy is an important issue," the bishops said in commending the resources, available online here.

Registration remains open for the final sessions, in March, of the 2024 Clergy Professional Development Days that include a workshop on how to avoid anti-Judaism in preaching and worship during Holy Week, led by the Rev. 2024 Leadership Report & Delegate Certification requested by March 1

Electing Convention: May 18 Annual Convention: Nov. 9

Parochial Reports due by March 1 The Leadership Report and Lay Delegate Certification Form are distributed annually to collect updated church and lay leadership contact information. Congregations are asked to submit the Congregational Leadership Report within 10 days of their annual meeting as required by diocesan canons (Canon 2.2) and no later than *Friday, March 1*.

The Leadership Report, which includes a link to the 2024 Diocesan Convention Delegate Certification Form, is available <u>here</u>.

The information provided through this report is critical to **make sure that important diocesan information reaches congregations' current leaders** in the upcoming year. It is imperative that congregations submit delegate data in a timely manner this year, as the convention to elect a new bishop is scheduled for *Saturday*, *May 18* at Trinity Church in Boston.

The online **filing site for the 2023 Parochial Report is open**. Parochial Reports are due to the Diocese of Massachusetts from its congregations by *Friday, March 1* and must be submitted on the filing site. **This information is used to calculate each congregation's assessment**. The Episcopal Church's General Convention Office sent an e-mail to congregation leaders with instructions on Dec. 21, 2023; see also the Parochial Report information page on the General Convention website, <u>here</u>, for forms and instructions. A video walk-through is available <u>here</u> to assist those who are new to the process or need a reminder on how to navigate the filing site. This year, the General Convention Office released a **new webbased app that helps tally** items on the Parochial Report relating to **church services and attendance**. Read more about it <u>here</u>.

The Parochial Report is the oldest, continuous gathering of data by The Episcopal Church. Interested in vital information on your congregation? The General Convention Office provides online tools for exploring Parochial Report trends, including 10-year history of attendance, pledge and plate income and membership for individual Episcopal churches.
