Registration is open for May 18 Electing Convention

Registration is now open for the special Diocesan Convention to elect the 17th bishop diocesan of the Diocese of Massachusetts, to take place on *Saturday*, *May 18* at Trinity Church in Boston. All attendees must pre-register here.

While the electing convention is open to all in the diocesan community, priority seating will be given to voting members and those with assigned credentials. Non-voting attendees will be seated on a first-come, first-served basis and as space allows. All voting will take place in person.

Preliminary details were e-mailed to clergy and delegates on March 19 and also are available, along with any subsequent updates, at www.diomass.org/electing-convention-2024. Questions may be e-mailed to convention@diomass.org.

Meet-and-Greets scheduled with bishop nominees

- Friday, May 10, 7-8:30 p.m. at Christ Church in Andover (with childcare); and
- Saturday, May 11, 10:30 a.m.-12 p.m. on Zoom (with special Zoom rooms for youth and young adults, as well as for all others).

Additionally, on *Thursday, May 9, 10:30 a.m.-12 p.m.*, there will be a "Coffee & Conversations with Clergy, Postulants and Candidates" session at St. Paul's Church in Dedham.

• Training opportunity for clergy, officers, vestry members and treasurers—especially those new to the positions: For many years, the diocesan Congregational Consultants ran Congregational Business Practices Workshops to educate congregational leaders about their responsibilities for the prudential (business) matters of their churches. After four long years, these in-person workshops will return in May or June.

A four-hour curriculum will be presented on several Saturday mornings at locations around the diocese. It covers vestry duties, bookkeeping and accounting, safeguarding of assets, and administrative responsibilities such as the Parochial Report and clergy compensation. **Consultant coordinators Edward Rewolinski and Betsy Blagdon need to hear from those who are interested so that they can plan enough sessions.** If online training in shorter sessions is preferable, please let them know that as well. • "Generation to Generation: Talking with Younger Adults about the Next Episcopate in the Diocese of Massachusetts": A panel discussion with leaders in their 20s, 30s and 40s will be
