Preparation begins for annual Diocesan Convention

The 239th annual Diocesan Convention will take place on *Saturday, Nov. 9* at the Marriott Boston Quincy hotel in Quincy. Preliminary information will be e-mailed to clergy, delegates and leadership in mid-June, and registration will open in late July.

The deadline for submitting all materials will be *Friday,* **Sept. 6**. This will be the final day to submit materials to the Convention Office, including nomination forms for elected positions, resolution submission forms and written reports. St. Paul Center convenes diocesan community for "Why Pray?" on July 27 The St. Paul Center for Theology and Prayer each summer hosts an in-person day to tackle a "big question" and this year asks: "Why Pray?" - The **Episcopal Church's 81st General Convention** takes place *June 23-28* at the Kentucky International Convention Center in Louisville. Among the highlights are the "Love Always" Episcopal Revival, 7-9 p.m. on July 22, featuring Presiding Bishop Michael B. Curry preaching his 27th and final Episcopal Revival sermon as he concludes his nine-year term; the *June 26* election of a new presiding bishop from a slate of five nominees; and elections for president (on *June 26*) and vice president (*June 28*) of the House of Deputies. GRANTS & LOANS:

- The Mission Strategy Committee of Diocesan Council encourages congregations, organizations and networks in the Diocese of Massachusetts to apply for **Wicked Good Idea Microgrants** of up to \$2,500 to take on a ministry idea in their mission settings. - The Church Home Society has launched a three-year pilot grant program, allocating up to \$40,000 a year to support **youth ministries in Episcopal churches**. Grant awards will be between \$1,000 and \$2,000. Applications (form available here) are due the last day of the month, August 2024 through April 2025, and they will be reviewed at the following monthly board meeting.
