Deacons available to preach on "Diaconate Sunday" June 15

Diocesan Convention resolutions process opens early this year

The resolutions submission process for Diocesan Convention is now open—earlier this year to facilitate wide participation. Guidelines and the resolution submission form are available here.

The submission deadline is *Friday*, *Sept. 5 by 5 p.m.* However, if a resolution is expected to have budgetary implications, submission by *July 31* is encouraged to allow for the possibility of 2026 diocesan budget funding should the resolution be adopted.

- Energy efficiency incentives for houses of worship: Mass-Save offers incentives, including 75 to 100 percent off the cost of insulation and air sealing, for houses of worship. CHURCHWIDE:

• The Church Pension Group (CPG) is switching to all-electronic billing and payments later this year. This means that CPG will stop sending paper bills and stop accepting paper checks for pensions and insurance products. The current timeline that CPG has provided for this change is August 2025. To make sure that all congregations and institutions continue to have access to the benefits they expect, each will need to have at least one person designated as an administrator in CPG's MyAdminPortal. This person can either be an "Institution Administrator" with full access to make changes to the roster of current employees, or a "Bill Payer" with access only to bills and the payment system and without ability to make changes to the employee roster.

Congregations that would like to establish an Institution Administrator prior to the roll-out of the new system may contact Nathaniel Fasman (nfasman@diomass.org) to get their account set up. Further information about the process will be made available in a stand-alone e-mail as it becomes available from CPG.
