

The Liturgy of Foot Washing

As we begin this symbolic act of servanthood the brothers remain seated. After the Presider has washed the Deacon and Subdeacon's feet, the Deacon and Subdeacon with wash the feet of the brothers sitting closest to the altar. After your feet are washed, wash the feet of the next brother down the apse. After the brothers farthest from the altar have their feet washed they will wash the feet of the Superior.


And particularly for the blessings given me this day and in this season.
