## 5 easy ways to incorporate Creation and climate justice into worship:

1. In baptismal liturgies (including Easter Vigil, All Saints', Baptism of Jesus, etc.)

Add the 6<sup>th</sup> baptismal promise as a permanent feature of your baptismal Liturgy:

Q: Will you cherish the wondrous works of God, and protect the beauty and integrity of all creation?

A: I will, with God's help.
