How will we use all that God gives us to build up the community of the church so that all might be healed and renewed? As you already know, we also will be celebrating and honoring the ministry of Bud Cederholm as he retires. His gifts for preaching and teaching will bless all of us during the closing Eucharist on Saturday, which marks the official end of his full-time ministry. The generous offering we give in thanksgiving that day will be designated for renovating the lake house at our Barbara C. Harris Camp and Conference Center into an energy-efficient, low-carbon impact retreat and sabbatical residence, to be named in Bud's honor.

To get ready for our work together in convention, please spend some time with the accompanying materials, and then plan to attend one of the pre-Convention forums in October to ask questions and learn about the important business that will come before us, including the proposed 2012 budget. Your participation, your leadership, your voice are critical to the diocesan ministry we share.

The congregations of our Cathedral Church of St. Paul are planning a warm welcome for all of us, and your bishops look forward to seeing you there.
