2011 PRICE LECTURERS ANNOUNCED FOR TRINITY CHURCH

All lectures are held on Sunday afternoon at 1:30 pm except as noted below. All lectures are free and open to the public.

BOSTON -- Trinity Church has announced the distinguished speakers who will deliver the Price Lectures for 2011.

World Food Prize laureate, the Rev. **David Beckman**, will speak on Sunday, March 13. Beckman has been president of Bread for the World since 1991, leading large-scale and successful campaigns to strengthen U.S. political commitments to overcome hunger and poverty in this country and globally.

The Rev. Dr. **Walter Brueggemann**, widely considered the most prominent and admired of American scholars writing and teaching about the Hebrew Scriptures, will speak on Sunday, March 20 and will also be preaching at the 9:00 am and 11:15 am worship services.

Popular American broadcast journalist, **Ray Suarez**, will speak on Sunday, April 3. Suarez is a 20 year veteran in the news business best known for his current role as senior correspondent for "The NewsHour with Jim Lehrer". Suarez is also a lifelong Episcopalian.

Brian McLaren will be featured at a special evening session on Wednesday, April 6 at 7:00 pm. McLaren is an author, speaker, pastor, and an ecumenical global networker among innovative Christian leaders, thinkers and ethicists.

Dr. **Timothy Johnson**, best known to television viewers as "Dr. Tim Johnson", will speak on Sunday, April 10. Johnson is an American academic, pastor, physician, television journalist, and writer.

The Price Lectures are a distinguished series of lectures presented each year during Lent at Trinity, and supported by an endowment established by the will of William Price, a parishioner and Vestryman of the parish in the 18th century. Price Lecturers from the recent past have included Dr. Horace Boyer: editor of Lift Every Voice and Sing, The Rev. Dr. James Forbes of Riverside Church, and The Very Rev. Frank Griswold, Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church (retired).

Trinity Church in the City of Boston, founded in 1733, has long been recognized as an urban crossroads for celebration, culture and conversation. In partnership with other leaders, Trinity hosts community wide events including international authors, lectures, and concerts.
