The Ministry Discernment Conference offered by the bishops and the Commission on Ministry takes place on *Saturday, Feb. 4*, 2017, 8:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m., at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston. The conference provides an in-depth look at the 2017 Ministry Discernment Handbook and gives potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts and to explore whether their call is to ordained ministry or committed lay ministry. **Online registration, available here, is required by Jan. 15, 2017.**

The implementation organizing team is responsible for coordinating the work of living into the new mission strategy adopted by Diocesan Convention in November. The Diocesan Council, bishops and staff share responsibility for the team. Its role is to identify short-term actions and goals for 2017, develop a prioritized, sequenced plan to inform the 2018 diocesan budget and continue an open, participatory process that includes regular communication with the diocesan community.

The team's co-chairpersons note: "The real work of implementation will involve members all around our diocese as we undertake both the initial actions outlined in the mission strategy as well as new ideas that emerge from continuing conversations about our mission."

Evensong to mark 40 years of women's ordination in this diocese

Bishop Barbara C. Harris and the Parish of the Epiphany (70 Church Street) in Winchester will join for Evensong on *Sunday*, *Jan. 22, 2017, at 5 p.m.*, to mark the 40th anniversary of women in the priesthood.

The late Rev. Canon M. Jeanne Sproat was ordained at the Parish of the Epiphany in January 1977, and was the first woman to be ordained a priest in the Diocese of Massachusetts following the 1976 General Convention's action to open ordination to women.

- Knitters needed to support "Comfort Cart" outreach: The Spiritual Care Department at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, led by the Rev. Katie Rimer, has instituted a "Comfort Cart" initiative for patients who die at the medical center. The chaplains bring a cart of fresh food, tissues, mints and a knitted "comfort shawl" to patients and families during the dying process. Families can then take the prayer shawl home, as a sacred reminder of their loved one. Families have been deeply appreciative of these shawls, and caregivers are struggling to keep up with the demand.
